Phase I - Equitable Access to Effective Educators School Diagnostic

Introduction

National data show that poor and minority students, English Language Learners and students with disabilities continue to be taught more often than their peers by inexperienced, out-of-field or ineffective teachers. As a result, the United States Department of Education (USDE) required states to develop equity plans and use evidence based strategies to address this issue. Kentucky's plan is focused on teacher preparation; recruitment, hiring and placement of teachers; providing supports for on-going, job-embedded professional learning; and strategies to retain teacher and leaders.

After analysis of our equity data information, the following points were noted:

- * Our school is mostly homogenous with only 2.9% of our population classifying as a minority
- *A large percentage (71%) of our student population comes from poverty. We actually believe that this number is lower than our actual percentage. Many of our families do not turn in their eligibility forms due to the fact our school has a free breakfast/lunch program for all students.
- * We have an experience faculty with over 90% of our students having more than 4 years experience.
- * Currently, we have over 12% of our population failing a class. This a clear indication the our school needs to better utilize our formative assessments and/or our RTI practices.

After the data analysis is complete, the school will then identify the barriers (challenges) for some of the identified trends. An identified barrier, for example, could be higher teacher turnover in priority schools as compared with non-priority schools. Once the barriers have been identified, then root causes of why the barriers exist will be included.

In identifying barriers to our trends, the trend of poverty is in itself one of our most prominent barriers. Research has clearly shown the connection between poverty and poor performance at school and absenteeism. One of the root causes for poverty in our county is the lack of industry available. Without local employment opportunities accessible, the trend of repeating generations living in poverty has been definitely noted in our residents. Our county population is generally is predominately made up of older residents, that do not have school-aged children. This has also led to a lack of community support to our educational initiatives. Drugs, absentee parents, and apathy is a barrier that impedes our students ability to overcome obstacles to their academic success.

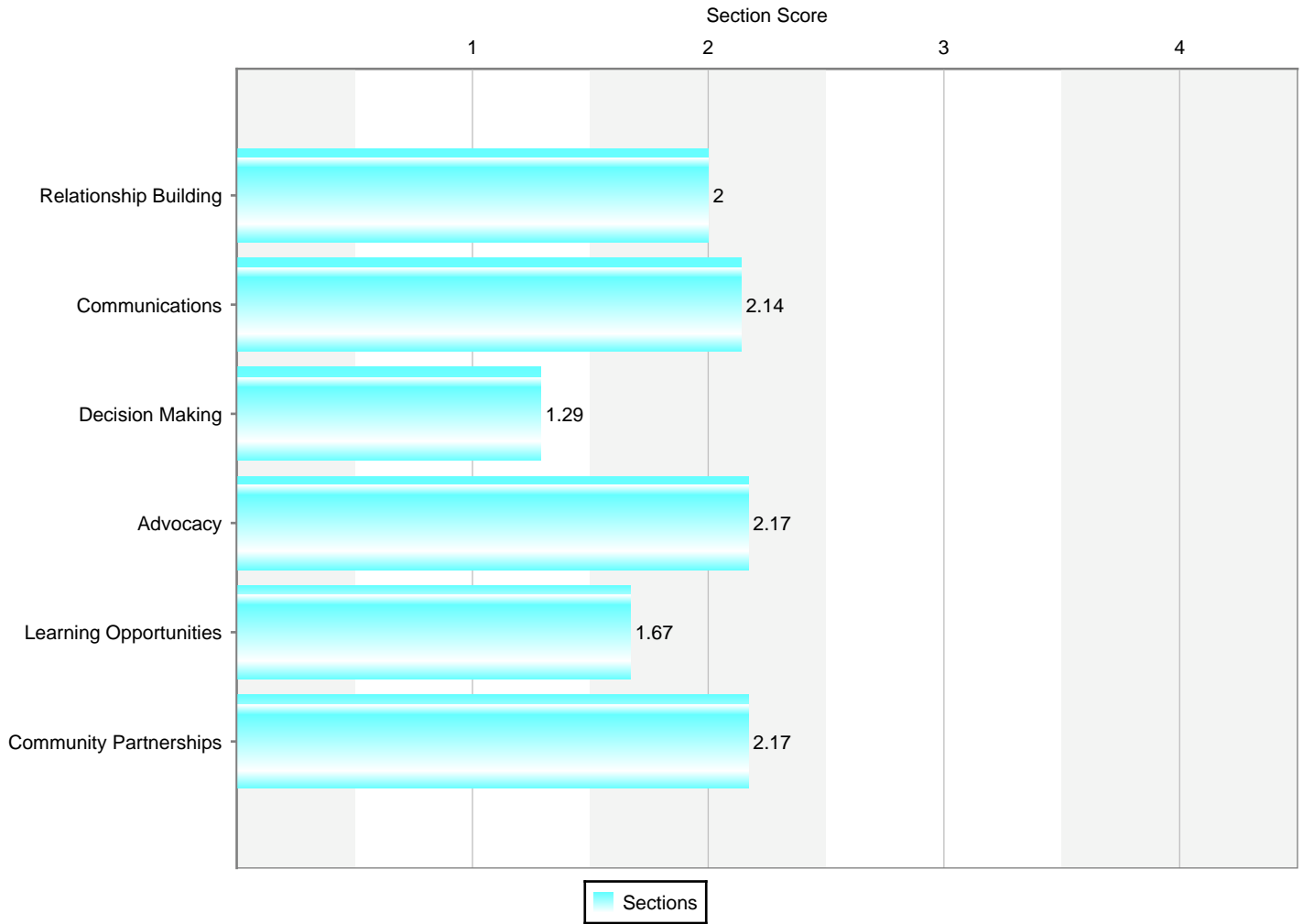

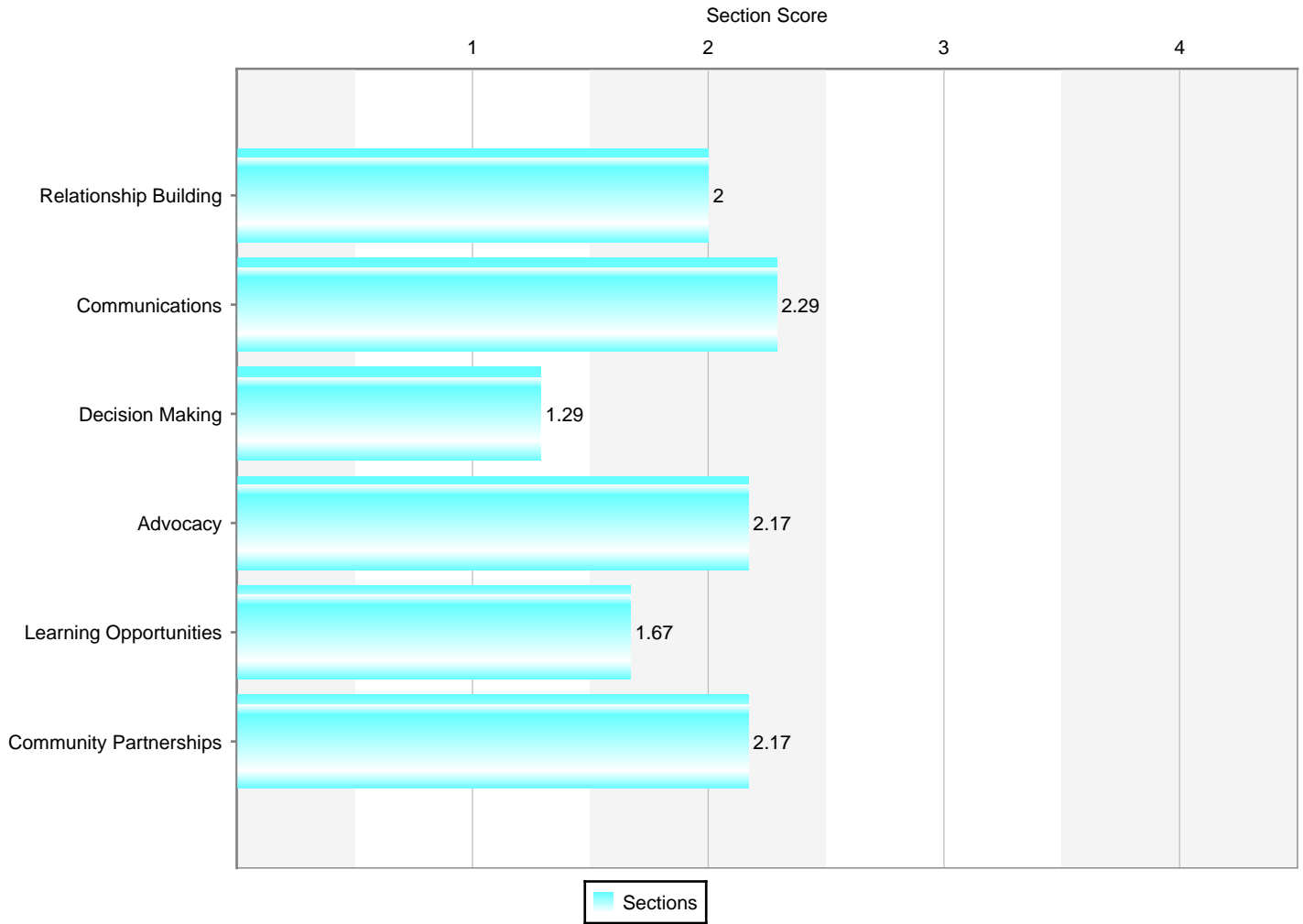

Stakeholders in our school, district and community were integral in developing Bath County High School's Comprehensive School Improvement Plan. Teachers, working in content-area groups, analyzed quantitative and qualitative data about student achievement and drafted 30-60-90 day plans, which are currently being implemented to increase student achievement and promote learning in every classroom. The data analysis and 30-60-90 days plans were completed by teachers during common planning sessions that are built into teachers' weekly schedules. Bath County High School teachers were invited to engage in a Leadership Team, and teachers in this group have proposed an implemented a variety of small-scale and large-scale plans to improve the culture and instruction at Bath County High School. This Leadership Team meets after school at a central location and on afternoons that are convenient to the teachers and administrators participating. Bath County district and the high school's administrative teams have had extensive discussions about past successes and failures and paths to greater success for all students moving forward. Parents of BCHS students were invited to complete a survey about the areas of strength that BCHS current supports and areas of needed improvement, and these results have been incorporated into the 30-60-90 day plans that are currently being implemented. This survey was available to parents at the Fall Open House, and also open to all parents who were not able to attend the Open House. Additionally, student leaders involved in Bath County High School's student government program have engaged with administrators in conversations of strategies to maintain beneficial programs and incorporate new, needed programs at the high school. Student Government participants are a group of elected, highly motivated students that represent the student population. Meetings of the Student Government participants take place during Study Zone and also on club days, so no instructional time is sacrificed to participate in this organization. The draft of the Comprehensive School Improvement Plan will be published on BCHS's website, and all stakeholders will be invited to comment and make suggestions for revisions and improvements.

Describe the representations from stakeholder groups that participated in the development of the improvement plan and their responsibilities in this process.

Teachers played a major role in developing the improvement plan. Teachers are on the front lines of instruction each day and know, better than any other group, how to improve student achievement and engagement. Teachers, working in common-planning groups, analyzed data and developed 30-60-90 day plans to improve instructional practices and remediation both immediately and for the duration of the school year. They are currently responsible for implementing the 30-60-90 day plans and for raising relevant issues with administration to further increase student achievement. The Leadership Team has taken on long-term idea gathering and problem solving, seeking initiatives that will have school-wide impacts on student growth and achievement. District and school administrative personnel have the role of providing resources and minimizing barriers to implementing the improvement plan. The administrative staff actively support the teachers in improving instruction. Parents have a unique perspective on the students of BCHS, a view that school staff often lack. Their main responsibility in the school improvement plan was to broaden the focus of the plan, ensuring that students have all their needs met, including emotional, social and health needs. The Student Government group has the responsibility of providing candid feedback to teachers and administrators about what initiatives are working and what further improvements must be made in order for all students to succeed at Bath County High School.

The draft of the Comprehensive School Improvement plan will be shared on the school's website, allowing all stakeholders to have free, open and convenient access at any time. Stakeholders received frequent communication about the progress in drafting the CSIP. Teachers were in close communication with school administrators in formulating the plan; the Leadership Team met often and spoke candidly with administrators about many elements of the CSIP; parents were invited to engage in the writing and revision process through involvement in the SBDM council and other avenues, which meets monthly.

Bath County High School is located in Owingsville, KY, the county seat of Bath County. Bath County is a rural community located in east central Kentucky along the I-64 corridor. Our community is blessed to enjoy such scenic beauty from our colonial homes on Main Street, our abundance of farmland, the Daniel Boone National Forest, and Cave Run Lake. Our county's population is approximately 12,000 residents. The school system is the largest employer in our community. We still have largely an agricultural based economy with 30% of our population living below the poverty level. Although only 73% of our county's population has a high school diploma, we are blessed to have a supportive community that has a vested interest in the success of our youth.

Bath County High School houses grades 9 - 12 with approximately 600 students. Our teacher to student ratio is 21 to 1. Our student population is predominately Caucasian, with a minority population of less than 1 percent. Approximately 6% of our student population has Individual Educational Plans. Approximately 74% of our population qualify for free and reduced lunch and we have a high transient population of approximately 35%. The school employs 41 full time certified employees and 17 classified employees. Our student attendance rate averages 90% and our cohort adjusted graduation rate is currently 93.3%. With the high number of students qualifying for free and reduced lunch and our high transient population, we do face a challenge in deterring students from dropping out of school due to financial issues at home or academic challenges. We strive constantly to motivate and support our student population.

Our school is blessed to offer dual credit courses, in collaboration with Morehead State University, in the content areas of English, Mathematics, and Sociology. Our close proximity to the university has been a great benefit to our student body, with numerous students receiving scholarships and grants to continue their post secondary education. We are also very proud of our classification as a Vocational Center with our offering of six vocational programs: Agricultural, Business, Consumer Sciences, Heath Sciences, and Informational Technologies. We also have a wonderful collaborative relationship with our local vocational schools (Montgomery County Technical Center and Maysville Community and Technical College) that provide dual credit offerings for our students.

As a school system we do face challenges typical for a rural community facing economic challenges. We are constantly facing issues with student motivation and high expectations. We believe in the success of our students and are dedicated to continue to improve our efforts so that all students can experience success!

Bath County High School is constantly striving to provide enhanced educational opportunities to our students. Within the past three years we proud to offer/achieve the following:

- * Expanded our collaborative effort with Morehead State University to offer more Dual Credit Classes
 - * KDE Accountability Performance Score from 67.3 (2014-2015) to 72.71 (2015-16)- obtaining the classification of a Proficient School
 - *Exceeded our Graduation Rate Goal of 91.1 with an actual score of 93.2
 - *Met our School set Goal of obtaining 100 points for our Program Reviews
 - *Exceeded our Social Studies EOC Goal of 58.4 with an actual score of 61.7
 - *On the Biology EOC, our percentage of novice students decreased by 5 %.
 - * On the English II EOC, the percentage of apprentice and distinguished students increased.
 - * On the Algebra II EOC, there was a large decrease in the percentage of novice students.
 - *On the Algebra II EOC, there was a huge increase in the percentage of proficient students.
 - * On the US History EOC, there was a decrease in the percentage of novice students.
 - * On the US History EOC, there was an increase in the percentage of distinguished students.
 - * BCHS students that took the US History EOC, matched the state distribution of US History EOC scores.
 - *Students ACT scores in Science increased.
 - * The overall composite score on the ACT increased.
 - * The percentage of students that scored at benchmark increased in English and Math (huge gain- almost at the state average).
- *Every CTE department at Bath County High School offers some type of Work-Based Learning (for example, Wildcat Exchange Bank, Sew Sew Shop, MNA training, and BCTV)
- *Incorporating various types of technology into our lessons, including Chrome Books
 - * Study Zone course in the zero period of our school day to allow our students time to read, study, and do homework; more importantly though, this zero period will allow us to offer tutorial services to our Gap Group students in all four content areas (math, science, social studies, and ELA).

2. Language mechanics are more novice compared to the state
3. Language mechanics are less distinguished compared to the state (only 1 point)
4. PLCS program review is Needs Improvement
5. World Language program review is Needs Improvement
6. Less proficient/distinguished than the state on English II EOC
7. More novice Algebra II EOC scores than the state
8. SIGNIFICANTLY less proficient/distinguished than the state on Algebra II EOC (19.1 vs. 42.3)
9. Less proficient/distinguished than the state on Biology EOC
10. More apprentice biology/algebra/English EOC scores compared to state
