### **1. Opening Business**

  - b. 2017-2018 Schedule: Rationale is in the Google Drive for a 7<sup>th</sup> period day. The middle school will be losing two positions. World Culture class is still on the schedule, but some changes can still be made.
  - c. Times for schedules are subject to change. There will be an English Elective instead of English 1. There are several options still being reviewed for different classes that will be offered. The new schedule will open up options for schedule changes for when students struggle with teachers or conflicts with other students. There will be smaller classes, 15 per class for math and ELA, but Science and Social Studies classes will be larger than that.  
There will be less class disruptions and pull-outs from classes. Some of the pull outs for different activities can be completed during study zone.  
Jennifer Wright motioned to adopt the 7<sup>th</sup> day period, Sasha Reinhardt seconded, all members agreed and it was approved.
  - d. Mr. Neace is trying to get vending for students at the end of the day during break. Jennifer Wright suggested having fundraisers for each grade level to sell vending during break.
  - e. There are many concerns regarding students who are failing several classes, but still participating in the extracurricular of band.

### 4. Budget Report

**Mr. Neace is combining money to look into buying furniture and calculators. Budget proposals are in the SBDM folder. The school is looking into buying two classroom sets of desks.**

The Library funds are staying at 15% of total budget. The money is broken down into sections for how the librarian is allowed to spend the money.  
The copier rental is \$12,000; and paper is \$8,000. With more use of Chromebooks, we may reduce amount of paper being used. Teachers need to be more aware of the amount of copies they use, and need to not waste copies.

The Academic Team received \$360, but will no longer be doing this. They will need to fundraise.

Increased furniture budgets for next year.

Instructional supplies are \$1500 for ELA.

Additional \$500 for ART. Teachers like what the art teacher does with the students, and do not want to see any cuts from this.

The counsellor receives \$300.

The Special Education Department receives \$1,000.

Gifted and Talented \$250.
